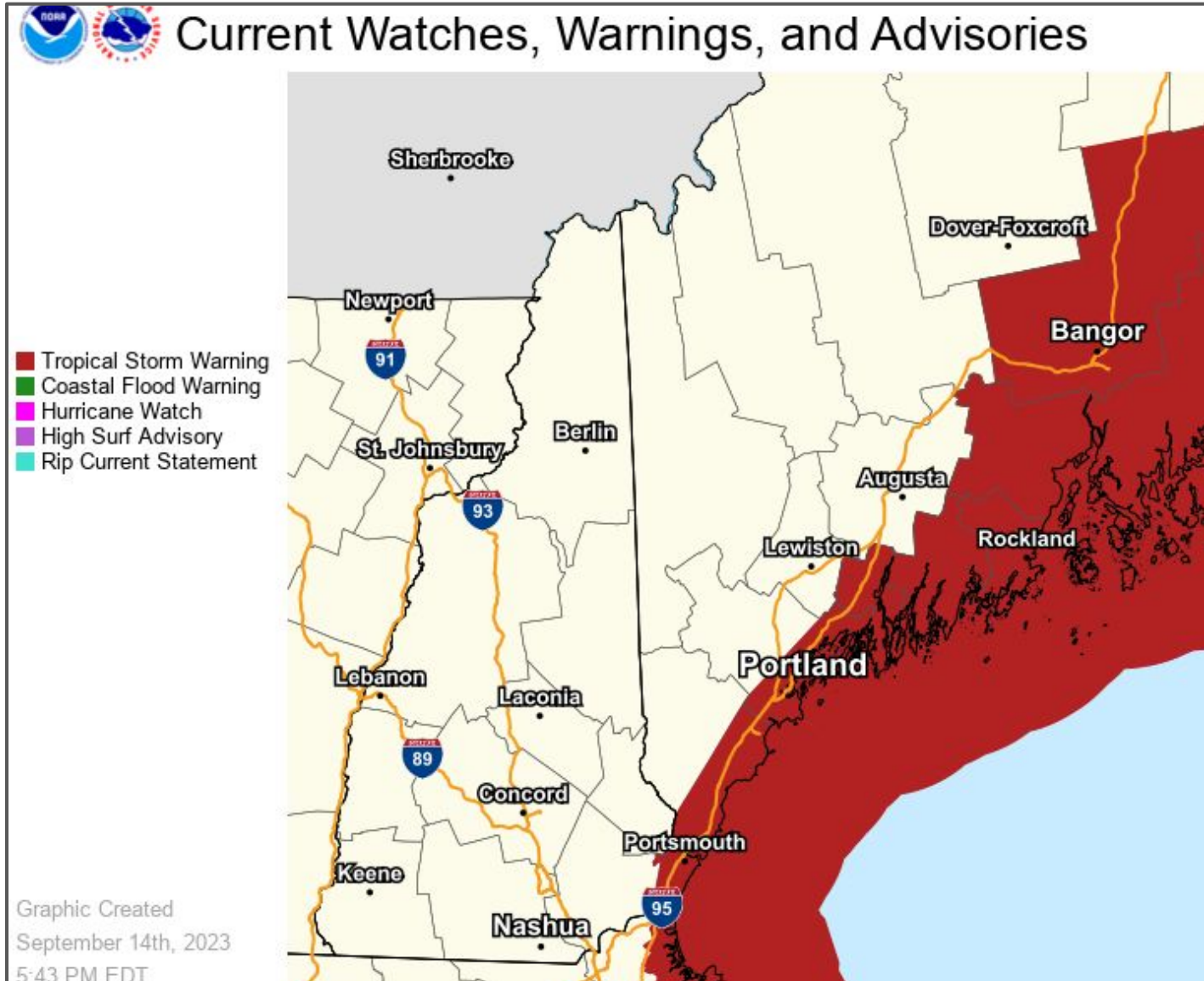




## Headlines for Hurricane Lee

## What To Expect



Dry conditions continue tonight and through the day Friday before rain moves in ahead of Lee Friday night. Rain will move out Saturday night.

- ✓ The heaviest rainfall will occur on Saturday with the highest totals over central and eastern Maine.
- ✓ Potential exists for flash flooding and small stream flooding.

Hurricane Lee's track, intensity, and impacts are becoming more clear, but some uncertainties remain.

- ✓ Tropical Storm Warnings are now in effect.
- ✓ Dangerous conditions will be present along the coast and will be expressed in Tropical Storm Warning products.
- ✓ Long period swell continues to increase through Saturday with increasing risk of beach and dune erosion as a result.
- ✓ Gusty winds on the coast and coastal waters. Broken tree limbs and some fallen trees may cause downed power lines.
- ✓ Possible storm surge of 2 to 3 feet may result in minor coastal flooding, with pockets of moderate flooding.

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
